PENTECOST

“When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit”
- Acts 2:1-4

Today is the feast of Pentecost, when we remember the event, which followed Christ’s Ascension when his disciples were baptized by the Holy Spirit. On that day, Peter delivered an inspiring sermon and 3,000 men and women were baptized becoming the first “church” in Jerusalem. The Apostles began to heal, to preach with a new confidence, and begin their separate -- but equally important -- missions throughout the world.

Just as the Holy Spirit came to the Apostles on Pentecost, so too does the Holy Spirit come to each one of us on our personal Pentecost at the time of our chrismation or confirmation. On the day of our baptism, when we are anointed with oil, we receive the sacrament of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, just as the Holy Spirit dwells in the Church, so too does the Holy Spirit dwell in each one of us. It is a personal gift to be experienced individually. The Holy Spirit unites us to Christ and enables us to live a Christ-centered existence.

MEMORIAL DAY

Tomorrow is Memorial Day, a solemn day set aside to remember the ultimate sacrifices made by men and women in the military. We

offers our prayers for the repose of souls of all those who have died in advancing the cause of liberty and freedom.

Through the centuries, soldiers have prepared themselves for the dangers of battle by reading Psalm 91—the “Soldier’s Psalm.” On Memorial Day, and with our own countrymen fighting bravely across the sea, we offer this prayer for all who have ever found themselves in harm’s way.

The Soldier’s Psalm - Psalm 91 (RSV)

He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High, who abides in the shadow of the Almighty, will say to the LORD, “My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust.”

For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence; he will cover you with his pinions, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness is a shield and buckler.

You will not fear the terror of the night, nor the arrow that flies by day, nor the pestilence that stalks in darkness, nor the destruction that wastes at noonday.

A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand; but it will not come near you. You will only look with your eyes and see the recompense of the wicked.

Because you have made the LORD your refuge, the Most High your habitation, no evil shall befall you, no scourge come near your tent.

For he will give his angels charge of you to guard you in all your ways. On their hands they will bear you up, lest you dash your foot against a stone.

You will tread on the lion and the adder, the young lion and the serpent you will trample under foot. Because he cleaves to me in love, I will deliver him; I will protect him, because he knows my name.

When he calls to me, I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble, I will rescue him and honor him. With long life I will satisfy him, and show him my salvation.

The front section contains the Armenian Krapar text and modern Armenian translation, while the latter part gives the English transliteration and translation. Page numbers are illuminated at the upper left and right sides of the main altar. Please sing along with any of the hymns which the choir is singing.

Confession and Holy Communion: Those who are prepared to receive Holy Communion may kneel in the center aisle or remain standing at their pew for the group recitation of the confession (p. 48-49). After the absolution please proceed via the central aisle towards the altar in an orderly manner. Two Parish Council members will be present to assist. Please return to your pew via the side aisles.
