

*Sunday School Lenten Drive*

This year's Lenten Drive will benefit two (2) charities: FAR's Helping Children Out of Poverty Project and United to End Genocide. On March 15th, a second plate will be passed for contributions and on March 22nd a bake sale will be held. Last year we raised approximately \$1200. This year our goal is \$1500. Please note that all of the Eastern Diocese Sunday Schools participate in this effort. The monies are pooled together by the Diocese, divided in half and then contributed on behalf of our collaborative efforts.

*Helping Children Out of Poverty Project:*

The overall mission of FAR's outreach to children in Armenia is to provide them and their families with tangible support programs that would empower them to meet critical challenges, stay intact, and thrive. Child poverty (single-parent households, unemployed parents, children with disabilities) is an acute problem in Armenia, especially in the Ararat region. According to official government data, 26% of Armenia's population is considered poor. Unfortunately, the real numbers may be much higher than the official data. In addition, the geographic coverage of services offered to children is not spread evenly throughout the country. This new project will assist 150-200 families. The Sunday School drive will support direct humanitarian needs: food and clothing.

*United to End Genocide:*

Beginning in 1915, ethnic Armenians living in the Ottoman Empire were rounded up, deported and executed on orders of the government. Including the Armenian Genocide, tens of millions of men, women and children have lost their lives in genocide or mass atrocities in the past 150 years. Millions have been brutalized and forced from their homes. Building on the proud legacy of the Save Darfur Coalition, Genocide Intervention Network, STAND and the Sudan Divestment Task Force, United to End Genocide, an American organization, is dedicated to preventing and ending genocide and mass atrocities worldwide by building a powerful, lasting movement of community activists, faith leaders, students, artists, investors and genocide survivors.
