To what can we compare the Kingdom of God? We know about the "mustard seed" (Matthew 13) but did you ever think of it as a Banquet? This is the exact analogy that Jesus uses in the story from today's Gospel. Banquets are a big part of our Christmas and holiday celebrations so it is no great effort to imagine, family, friends, abundance, good times, leisure and generous outpourings of hospitality and good cheer. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay

you. You will be repaid at the resurrection of the just."

When one of those who sat at table with him heard this, he said to him, "Blessed is he who shall eat bread in the Kingdom of God!" But he said to him, "A man once gave a great banquet, and invited many; and at the time for the banquet he sent his servant to say to those who had been invited, 'Come; for all is now ready.' But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have brought a field, and I must go out and see it; I pray you, have me excused.' And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to examine them; I pray you have me excused.' And another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.' So the servant came and reported this to his master. Then the householder in anger said to his servant, 'Go out quickly to the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in the poor and maimed and blind and lame.' And the servant said, 'Sir, what you commanded has been done, and still there is room.' And the master said to the servant, 'Go out to the highways and hedges, and compel people to come in, that my house may be filled. For I tell you, none of those men who were invited shall taste my banquet."
